# NATIONAL DAY of PRAYER

## Sunday May 16, 2021

Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, and faithful in prayer – Romans 12:12

- 3. Essential Workers... May God grant protection as they serve on the frontlines.
- 4. The Poor and Marginalized... May God protect those who are especially vulnerable.















- 5. Government Leaders and Policy Makers... May God grant wisdom and a desire to work for the good of all – both at home and abroad.
- 6. Our Churches... May God use us to provide support and hope as we care for the most vulnerable in our neighbourhoods and around the world.
